Our municipality – who we are

The traditional owners of the area are the Wadawurrung, Gulidjan and Gadubanud people

- Established on 9 March 1994
- Approx. 1,556 km² in area
- One of 19 'Large Rural Shires' in Victoria

Among the fastest growing regional municipalities in Victoria


- Population forecast in 2019 is 32,651
- Population forecast in 2036 is 45,717
- > 3% annual average growth sustained
- ~ 5% annual growth Torquay/Jan Juc





Our municipality – what we do

Over 3,227 businesses drive our economy and generate nearly \$1.25 billion annually





Three related but distinct economies

- Torquay is a centre for the Surf industry and is attracting new entrepreneurs and startups
- 2. The Coast Economy has a strong tourism market
- 3. The Hinterland has an agribusiness base with some farms exporting nationally and internationally, with a small but growing agritourism sector






