Note to Councillors and Officers

Declaration of Interest

In accordance with Section 130 of the Local Government Act 2020 (the Act), there is an obligation to declare a conflict of interest in certain situations including matters being considered by Council.

A conflict of interest can be a general conflict of interest under section 127 of the Act, or a material conflict of interest under section 128 of the Act.

A Councillor, a non-Councillor member of a delegated committee or member of Council staff has a general conflict of interest in a matter if an impartial, fair-minded person would consider that the person's private interests could result in that person acting in a manner contrary to their public duty.

A Councillor, a non-Councillor member of a delegated committee or member of Council staff has a material conflict of interest in respect of a matter if they or another affected person (as defined in section 128(3)) would gain a benefit or suffer a loss depending on the outcome of the matter.

Please note that some general exemptions apply and are set out in section 129 of the Act.

Disclosure of Interest

A Councillor must make full disclosure of a conflict of interest by either advising Council at the meeting immediately before the matter is considered at the meeting, or advising the Chief Executive Officer in writing prior to the meeting. While the matter is being considered or any vote taken, the Councillor with the conflict of interest must leave the room and notify the Chairperson that they are doing so. This notification must include the nature of the conflict and whether the interest is a general or material conflict of interest.

A Council officer must disclose the conflict of interest when providing information and before the information is considered.

Councillors and Council staff will also be required to complete a conflict of interest declaration form.

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to hear submissions relating to the Ocean Acres Reserve – Bike Park and Open Basin Upgrade Project.

Summary

On 10 December 2019, Council affirmed the viability of the development of a BMX track and open basin upgrade within Ocean Acres Reserve to increase activities available for all ages and to encourage more kids to be active in their local park. This project responds to an idea put forward by a young resident of Ocean Acres, and supported by over 40 signatures from other residents. Council has since been successful in securing \$80,000 from the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (Phase 1) to deliver the project.

The Ocean Acres Reserve – Bike Park and Open Basin Upgrade Project is exempt from a Planning Permit as the total project cost is under \$1M within a Public Park and Recreation Zone (PPRZ). Council's Capital Works Community Engagement Policy (SCS-025) guides community consultation relating to capital works that do not trigger a Planning Permit and a letter was sent to all Ocean Acres Estate residents in January seeking feedback to the proposal, noting the following project features:

- Upgrade and enhance existing drainage area to become a more attractive and usable public open space.
- Integrate improved drainage outlet with open grasses areas and a dry creek bed providing nature play opportunities.
- Develop a new local bike park for all ages on one third of the site, improving the use and functionality of a largely unused area.

A total of 29 submissions were received including 14 in support, 14 opposing and 1 neutral submission summarised as follows:

Council's Capital Works Community Engagement Policy outlines a process where opposition to the proposal is received. Officers convened two mediation meetings on 12 and 26 May 2021 which Cr Mike Bodsworth, Cr Paul Barker, Cr Gary Allen and Cr Adrian Schonfelder attended to hear from community members as to why they support or oppose the project.

A negotiated outcome could not be reached so a Special Council Meeting has now been scheduled on 20 July 2021 inviting all submitters to address Council. Following this a report will be presented at the 24 August 2021 Council meeting to determine if the project proceeds.

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to hear submissions relating to the Draft Surf Coast Shire Social Housing Plan.

Summary

At its meeting held on 25 May 2021, Council resolved to publicly exhibit the Draft Surf Coast Shire Social Housing Plan and publish a public notice inviting submissions.

Summary of Submissions

26 submitters completed a survey on the plan with three of those providing an additional written submission. Two submitters did not complete the survey but did provide a written submission.

18 submissions were received in support of the draft plan, with some changes proposed, and 10 submissions were received in objection to the draft plan.

1.	Individual	In support	Submitter has expressed support for Council's proposal to assist land owners to make contact with relevant organisations, citing the underutilisation of strategically located landholdings. Submitter expressed support for the proposal to work with Homes Victoria, however also recommends that Council explores other local opportunities for collaboration. Submitter is supportive of Council's proposal to consider the role of Greenfield development sites, and recommends the development of an appropriate mechanism be considered by Council. Submitter has expressed concern relating to future land use and supports Council investment in in this project.
2.	Individual	In support	Submitter has noted a shortage of low cost housing in the Anglesea area.
3.	Individual	In support	Submitter has expressed a high level of support for all aspects of the proposal, noting a strong need for social housing in the municipality.
4.	Individual	In support	Submitter has expressed a high level of support for all aspects of the proposal, noting the importance of community consultation and the need to update the plan when new Census data is available.
5.	Individual	In support	Submitter has expressed a high level of support for all aspects of the proposal.
6.	Individual	Objection	Submitter has expressed concern that socio-economic data does not justify provision of social housing in coastal areas, suggesting attention be focussed on Winchelsea or Geelong growth areas, and is concerned Council is using social housing as a rationale for urbanising coastal communities.

24.	Individual	Objection	Submitter has expressed objection to all aspects of the proposal, noting housing is the responsibility of the State Government. Submitter expresses concern that social housing stigmatises people and incentives to purchase a home should be offered instead.
25.	Individual	In support	Submitter has expressed support for the proposal noting that social housing should be distributed across all areas of the Shire.
26.	Individual	In support	Submitter has expressed support for all aspects of the proposal.
27.	Organisation	In support	Submitter has expressed support for the plan to increase the amount of social housing available across the Shire, however for the Plan to be complete, more detail describing development principles and intent is required. Submitter states the Action Plan should contains more robust and specific actions to improve its credibility and accountability. Submitter states Council will need to devote time and energy to convince communities of the great benefits to be gained by investing in new social housing.
28.	Organisation	In support	Submitter has expressed support for the plan and suggests gathering further information from to develop a fuller picture of housing affordability issues. Submitter notes the importance of balancing social housing needs against community infrastructure requirements when considering the use of Council-owned land.

The issues raised in the submissions will be considered in detail in a report to be presented to the 24 August Council meeting.

That Council receives and notes the submissions relating to the Draft Surf Coast Shire Social Housing Plan and forwards to Council for consideration.
