

Tips on managing your kerbside bins

- 1. Bins should not be placed on the kerbside more than 24 hours before the scheduled collection day. Empty bins should be brought in within 48 hours after the collection. Under Council's Local Law, penalties may apply.
- 2. Do not overfill bins. Overfull bins attract wildlife, such as cockatoos that scavenge and create litter. Residents are responsible for picking up litter created from overfull bins where lids are not closed.
- 3. Bags of household waste sitting next to bins will not be picked up. If it doesn't fit in the bin, wait until the next collection or take it to your closest transfer station or waste drop-off site.

Find your local transfer station at surfcoast.vic.gov.au/transfer

- 4. Fees will apply for some waste taken to the transfer station, but up to 0.5m3 (about a car boot load) of sorted household recycling and glass bottles and jars is accepted free of charge.
- 5. Never put batteries, e-waste, liquids, hot ashes or chemicals in any kerbside bins. Check **surfcoast.vic.gov.au/otherwaste** for other recycling and disposal options.



And remember, ALL food and garden waste from your household goes in your FOGO (Food Organics and Garden Organics) bin.
