CUMBERLAND RIVER CYPRESS TREES INCORPORATED PLAN JUNE 2006

1.0 Application

This incorporated plan applies to the Cumberland River Camping Ground, Lorne. Identified in the Surf Coast Planning Scheme as HO79.

2.0 Statement of Significance

What is significant?

The Cypress trees in the picnic area at the front of the camping ground within the road reserve.

Why is it significant?

The Cumberland River Reserve is of local significance because of its historical and aesthetic values. It has been a popular place of recreation since the late 19-century. This significance of the place is derived from the Cypress Trees and ford together with the Inter war Bungalow styled picnic shelter.

3.0 Elements of particular significance

The Cypress trees on the picnic area at the front of the camping ground within the Cumberland River Camping Ground (reserve) are of particular significance.
