RECYCLING

Empty plastic containers, paper, cardboard, and metals go in the bin with the yellow lid.

Never put plastic bags or soft plastic packaging in the recycling bin - items should go in loose.

PLASTICS

Rigid plastic with the numbers 1, 2 or 5



- Milk and other drink bottles
- Yoghurt, ice cream and margarine tubs
- Detergent and shampoo bottles
- ✓ Deodorant (roll-on)
- **✓** Berry punnets
- **✓** Biscuit trays
- ✓ Takeaway containers

PAPER/CARDBOARD METALS

- **✓** Boxes (uncoated)
- **✓** Newspapers
- ✓ Envelopes (you can leave the clear windows in)
- Food packaging such as pizza boxes, only if empty and not too soiled
- **✓** Egg cartons

- **✓** Drink cans
- Tins and cans, including pet food cans
- Empty aerosol cans (lid off)
- Aluminium foil (no food residue and scrunched into a ball the size of a golf balls or larger)
- ✓ Aluminium foil trays empty and clean only
- Metal lids from jars & bottles (not wine caps)



Recycling must go in the bin loose. Never put plastic bags or soft plastic packaging in this bin. Small plastic lids (like from milk or juice cartons) should be removed and placed in the landfill bin. Metal beer bottle lids can go into the recycle bin, but aluminium wine caps can't. Empty all containers and remove lids. No need to wash items, just scrape them clean.
