# Early Years Services – QA2.223 Bush/Beach Kindergarten Protective Clothing & Visibility

## Purpose

This policy outlines Surf Coast Shire Council's commitment to ensuring the safety, health and wellbeing of children when participating in the early Years Services Bush and Beach Kinder activities in regards to:

Due for Review:

- Appropriate clothing to be worn by children and staff whilst attending Bush/Beach kinder, in various weather conditions.
- Ensuring children and staff at Bush/Beach kinder are clearly visible and identifiable to each other and members of the public.

## Scope

This policy applies to all Surf Coast Shire Council Early Years Services staff, students, volunteers, children and their families accessing the services.

## Policy

#### The Surf Coast Early Years Management is responsible for:

- approving Bush/Beach kinder sites in with consultation with SCS open space and environment departments or other external land managers. and GORPACA
- ensuring all Bush/Beach Kinder groups have approved risk assessments in place
- ensuring staff have read all policies and work instructions related to bush/beach kinder practices
- providing appropriate identification methods for children and staff to wear to ensure that they are identifiable

#### Staff/educators are responsible for:

- ensuring risk assessments have been completed for bush/beach kinder sites and approved by Management
- ensuring parent/guardians have signed the parent authority form for their child to attend bush/beach kinder
- all staff sign the applicable site WH&S bush/beach kinder checklist at the beginning of each session
- staff assess potential tree climbing trees for sturdiness in liaison with the Coordinator of Open space operations
- ensuring strategies to mitigate the risks and hazards of tree climbing are carried out as required;



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- educating the children on water risks, providing an awareness of bodies of water and associated risks and teaching them appropriate behaviour around water.
- ensure strategies to mitigate risks and hazards in relation to water are carried out as required;
- encouraging the children to do things for themselves e.g. climbing and holding back branches, assessing risk through conversation with staff;
- taking opportunities to reinforce safety routines applicable to play wherever possible.
- continually practicing and educating children on snake bite prevention behaviours while at Bush/Beach Kinder, without fostering an unnatural fear or paranoia of snakes.
- encouraging parents to teach children snake bite prevention behaviours outside of Bush/Beach Kinder (for example, on family walks in the bush).
- encouraging parents to practice safe dog behaviours at home and to teach children on an ongoing basis how to behave around dogs to minimise risk of dog bites;
- running a 'Responsible Pet Education' session for each kindergarten group, with children, parents and staff. Particular attention in the session is given to recognising the warning signs given by dogs, the correct way to approach a dog and what to do if approached by an aggressive dog;
- continually educating children on the appropriate behaviours around dogs, including recognising warning signs, the correct way to approach a dog, and what to do if approached by an aggressive dog;
- follow procedures in the event of a dog in attack mode;
- ensuring all children are wearing identifiable ID bracelets and high visibility vests.
- ensuring all staff, volunteers and students are wearing high visibility vests
- ensuring all staff, volunteers and students are wearing appropriate clothing and footwear

#### Parents/guardians are responsible for:

- Ensuring that children are wearing appropriate clothing and footwear;
- reading and being familiar with the policy;
- · bringing relevant issues to the attention of both staff and committee

#### Identifiable clothing:

Bush Kinder children will be clearly identifiable through wearing ID wrist bracelets and high visibility vests. Staff, volunteers and students will be identifiable by wearing high visibility vests.

#### Appropriate/Protective Clothing

The Surf Coast Shire Council Bush/Beach Kinder program is intended to operate across a broad spectrum of weather conditions, allowing children and staff to experience nature and its elements across the seasons. Children are encouraged to take the lead in playing, exploring and learning in a bush or natural environment.

For this reason, there is some particular clothing requirements in the Bush/Beach Kinder setting that may differ from requirements in a centre-based environment.



#### Protective and appropriate clothing & footwear:

It is important that <u>all Bush Kinder participants, including staff, volunteers, students and children</u>-wear appropriate and protective clothing and footwear which:

- allows children to move freely and undertake activities such as climbing, balancing and running;
- keeps children warm and dry in cold/wet weather;
- protects children from the damaging effects of the sun, UV rays in warm weather and high UV conditions;
- prevents sunburn, bites, scratches and stings. (Even in warm weather, long sleeve tops and long pants are recommended - this clothing should be loose fitting and light);
- footwear should keeps feet and toes covered and have a flexible sole to allow children to climb and balance on uneven surfaces;

Cold Weather / Rain	Puddle suits, waterproof jacket, waterproof pants, long pants, long sleeved top, beanie, waterproof gloves, thermals in very cold weather	Short sleeved tops, skirts, dresses or shorts	Non-waterproof clothing Open toe shoes, sandals, thongs, crocs, singlet tops/dresses

For hygiene reasons, Bush Kinder identifiable broad brimmed hats and beanies will **NOT** be provided by the kindergarten. Parents will be asked to provide these items for their children so that headwear is not being shared between children.
