What is the OPLE pilot program?

Local government and Environment Protection Authority Victoria (EPA) play a vital role in responding to pollution and waste issues that compromise environmental and public health, and adversely impact livability and amenity.

As part of its response to the independent inquiry into EPA, the Victorian Government has committed \$4.8 million to implement a pilot program of Officers for the Protection of the Local Environment (OPLEs).

The OPLE pilot program will see 11 officers authorised under the *Environment Protection Act 1970* and embedded within 13 local councils across Victoria. It will run through to the end of 2018.

The goals of the pilot program are:

- · to improve responses to pollution and complaints
- to improve industry compliance with their environmental obligations
- to prevent and reduce harm from pollution
- to improve capability and relationships between local government and EPA.

- City of Greater Dandenong
- Wyndham City Council
- Surf Coast Shire Council
- Mildura Rural City Council
- Greater Shepparton City Council
- City of Wodonga
- Loddon Shire Council, Buloke Shire Council and Central Goldfields Shire Council (shared OPLE)
- Brimbank City Council and Hobsons Bay City Council (shared OPLE).
