THINGS TO SEE & DO

Beaches

There are two patrolled beaches during the summer period including Anglesea's main beach just off the Great Ocean Road and Point Roadknight Beach.

Learn To Surf

Located right opposite Anglesea Main Beach, Go Ride a Wave offers daily learn to surf classes, surf hire and has a large retail store.

Great Ocean Road Adventure Tours hire out surf gear, canoes and bikes. They also operate tours for groups only.

Shopping

Anglesea has many retail outlets to browse including gift shops, boutique clothes shops and surf shops along with all the necessities such as a supermarket, bank, newsagency, Post Office and Pharmacy.

Enjoy a BBQ at one of the many sites available along the Anglesea River with picnic tables, BBQ facilities and toilets.

The **Anglesea River** is ideal for numerous activities to suit all ages, including canoeing, windsurfing, sailing, stand-up paddleboards and paddleboat hire.

Eating Out

Anglesea has a variety of fantastic cafes, restaurants and eateries to choose from.

Wineries and local produce

There are many fantastic local wine and food producers in the region. Pick up a copy of the Otway Harvest Trail and go on a mouth watering tour of the Surf Coast hinterland. Seasonally opened.

Cycling is a great way to explore the Surf Coast, with world-famous coastal scenery and an ever-changing hinterland providing great opportunities for all levels of cyclists, from families to seasoned professionals.

Skate Park is located between the Bowling Club and the Lions Park, Cameron Road.

Anglesea Golf Course is Famous for the hundreds of kangaroos that graze happily on its undulating fairways this 18hole course is set amongst native bushland. Enjoy a round of golf or take in the panoramic views from the Clubhouse.

There are plenty of **fishing** spots along the Surf Coast. Popular spots around Anglesea include the Anglesea River Mouth, Point Roadknight, Hutt Gully and Urqharts Bluff. Common catches include Snapper and Salmon.

Mountain Bike Riding is permitted in the Anglesea Heath and Great Otway National Park on designated shared tracks and formal vehicle tracks.

MARKETS AND GALLERIES

Anglesea Riverbank Market is held on the Anglesea Riverbank with assorted stallholders featuring handmade crafts, food and more. Held on various Sundays throughout January, March Long Weekend and Easter.

Anglesea Heath

View the superb native flowers and rare orchids that bloom in the coastal heathlands during spring. Amazingly, over a quarter of Victoria's plant species grow here including more than 100 varieties of orchids. Many vehicle tracks offer photographers, walkers,



artists and bird watchers great viewing opportunities. Dusty Miller, Honeyspots and Harrisons South tracks are great places to explore the heath in Spring.

Coogoorah Park

Start at the Visitor Centre on the river and follow the river upstream, across the bridge to Coogoorah Park. Once you cross the Great Ocean Road, walk along the eastern side of the river. Take the bridges to the Pirate Ship Playground and check out the boardwalk through the reeds. There are numerous BBQ facilities and toilets.

Point Addis Koorie Cultural Walk

This walk is a 2km return (or 1 hour) walk that commences from Point Addis. There are signs along the way that interpret aspects of their unique way of life and show how they lived in harmony with the environment.

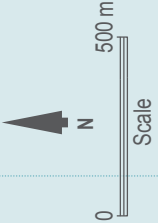
